## WHAT IS STAND TALL?

- A voluntary approach to drug prevention open to all students and staff.
- Members of the DePaul Catholic Community pledge to remain drug free and submit to random drug testing.
- Provides students and staff members and opportunity to take a personal and collective stand against drug abuse and drug-related activities.
- Members realize they are not alone when they make the courageous and correct choice to say no to drugs.

## HOW DOES STAND TALL WORK?

- Parent and student sign the membership contract.
- Random testing takes place each school day throughout the academic year.
- Each member is assigned a number and the numbers of the members to be tested are randomly selected.
- Screening is through a cheek swab administered by the student, observed by the Vice-Principal and/or school nurse.

## WHY SHOULD YOU JOIN STAND TALL?

- Experience personal pride.
- Demonstrate Christian values.
- Demonstrate strength of character.
- Always have a reason to say no to drugs!
